The objective of this conference is for health and medical education programs within the Alaska Native, Native American, and Native Hawaiian communities to grow in capacity, and to grow in their ability to implement culturally appropriate models of health care and service delivery systems that improve the health and wellness of Native peoples. The disparities in health care amongst Native peoples will be addressed through the application of scientific advances in medicine, in congruence with traditional healing and culturally holistic practices. To “ho`oulu” [cause growth and inspiration] in this knowledge, we begin by building medical training opportunities, faculty development programs, and diversity in biomedical research and the health care workforce of, and for, Native peoples.
